MaxFund makes CHAMPS!

Dogs are often relinquished to shelters because of behavior issues that went unaddressed in their prior homes. At most shelters, behavior issues can mean a death sentence for a relinquished dog. But MaxFund's no-kill philosophy means that dogs can get a second chance at finding a great forever family, no matter how long it takes.

Even with the luxury of time, though, behavior issues can present a significant impediment to finding a forever home. A dog could be returned to the shelter again and again if those issues are not addressed effectively.

That's where MaxFund's Champs program comes in. A dog participating in Champs may have a significant issue, such as dog-reactiveness. Or the dog may just need a bit of continuing education on something like leash walking. Champs dogs are taken through six weeks of training by MaxFund volunteers, led by a volunteer professional dog trainer. At the end of the course, participating dogs receive a certificate and ribbon. Notes are kept in their files, and their volunteer trainers make themselves available as a continuing resource to adopting families.

The Champs program was conceived by Diane Kirkpatrick, a long-time MaxFund volunteer. She learned of a similar program being conducted by a Boulder animal rescue organization, and saw how it could benefit MaxFund dogs during their shelter stays. So she found a volunteer professional trainer, and the Champs program was born. The inaugural session of Champs was held in 2005, and Diane has kept the program going ever since. She enlists the assistance of volunteer professional trainers (currently Valerie Lambert) and a corps of volunteers who take MaxFund dogs through the six-week Champs courses.

Since 2005, hundreds of dogs have been taken through Champs training, and have benefited greatly. Diane says that many of the dogs who have been through Champs are memorable, but some who stand out for her include:

Chef is a German Shepherd who was uneasy about being touched or brushed. His training, with Diane serving as his Champs trainer, focused on making touching and brushing a fun and pleasurable activity. An extremely smart and handsome dog, he ultimately found a fabulous forever home with a former volunteer Champs trainer!

Dundee is a lively and intelligent Cattle Dog mix who had dog reactivity issues. During his initial Champs classes with Peg, his Champs trainer, he couldn't even be in the training area with other dogs. But after a few sessions, he became confident enough to join the rest of the class and became one of the star pupils! He also found a great home.

Molly-Dharma is a lanky, gorgeous girl who looks like a Shepherd-Irish Wolfhound mix. She had such a variety of behavior issues that it seemed unlikely she would ever find a home. But Ken, her Champs trainer, came to love and champion her. When she found a loving human who was willing to adopt her, issues and all, Ken continued to help in her transition. She's the superstar who lends her name to the Molly-Dharma Motorcycle Run for MaxFund every year, and she's a happy and well-adjusted dog.

Diane says that the Champs program is rewarding for both dogs and humans. Dogs learn skills, gain confidence, and let go of behavior issues that may be keeping them from finding forever homes. Volunteers also get an opportunity to hone their confidence in working with and training dogs. And everyone has lots of fun along the way!

The 6-week Champs courses are scheduled quarterly, except during winter months. The next session of Champs will begin in late February or early March of 2012. All volunteers who have completed the MaxFund volunteer orientation are welcome to participate.

Prospective adopters who are looking for Champs dogs can identify them by the Champs ribbon decorating their kennels. Champs...it's a win-win for canines and humans alike!

They tell me a two-legger named Pavlov proved this long ago but two-leggers just can't believe that it is true.

Sure, the stranger probably would have kept walking down the sidewalk anyway even if I hadn't barked. But it is a conditioning problem, not a logic problem. If every time this annoyance appears I bark. And every time I bark the annoyance disappears...duh!

Keep on barking folks. You'll figure it out.

Tami and her husband, Rog, have been fostering for MaxFund since 2007, and in that time, they have fostered 12 animals. Although all of their fosters are dear to them, a few really stand out. Roger was an older cat who was

dumped at a vet's office because he was too old and missing his litter box, and his family didn't want him anymore. He was transferred to the MaxFund, where it was discovered that he had cancer. Tami and Rog decided to foster Roger so he could live out however much time he had remaining in a home. Roger was lucky to be able to live with them and receive attention time (and plenty of sunshine) until he passed five weeks later.

Another standout is Copper aka Slappy. The sweet-natured lab/shepherd mix had lived on the streets and had a pretty tough life before getting inoperable prostate cancer and ending up at MaxFund.



For two months—until he passed away—Copper lived with Tami and Rog, where he went for walks, ate boiled chicken and lay on Tami's feet every night with the rest of the pets. Because of Tami and Rog, Copper died with people who loved him, who held his head and told him he was loved as he passed.



Hospice fostering isn't all Tami and Rog do. They also take in other animals who need love, care and hope. Larry is a diabetic dog that ended up at MaxFund blind and deaf. MaxFund gave Larry eye surgery, so he got his sight back. Tami and Rog then cared for him—including giving insulin injections—

until Larry got adopted. Of course, Tami and Rog have had some "failed fosters" as well. Bella is a large, dilute calico who was really stressed at the shelter and needed a break from the shelter. After fostering her for a little while, they decided to adopt Bella. Tippy (a dog) was also a "foster failure."



WHY DOES SHE FOSTER

Tami has a huge heart and wants to help in any way she can. According to her, "the opportunity to get to know another animal, even if only for a little while, is a wonderful gift." Further, when one of her hospice fosters passes away, her consolation is that she "gave the best she could."

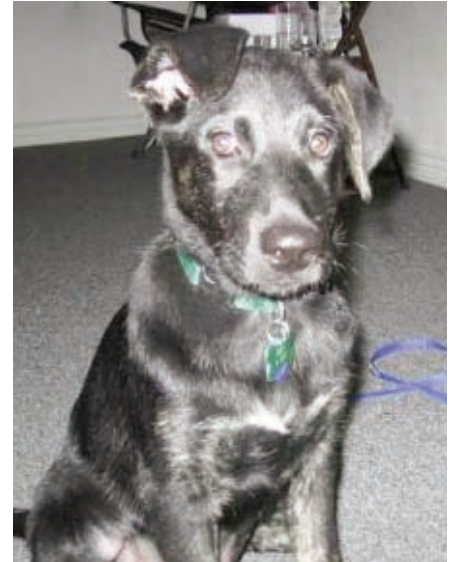

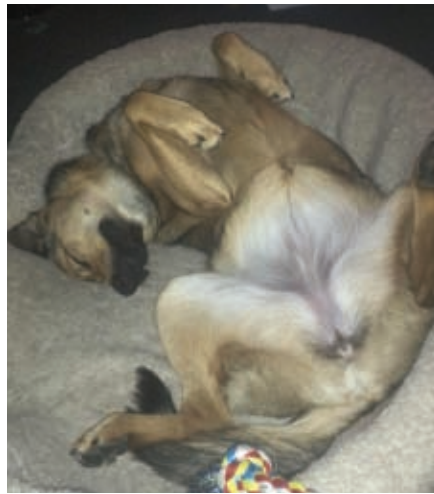
Hi Amy and Everyone at MaxFund!

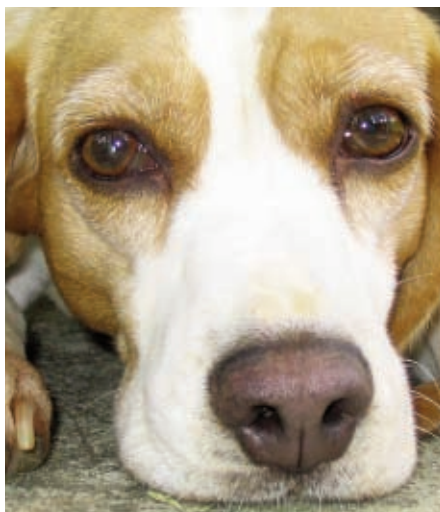
Will and Pippa

It is not a good idea to try to lap up the powdered creamer before it dissolves in boiling coffee.

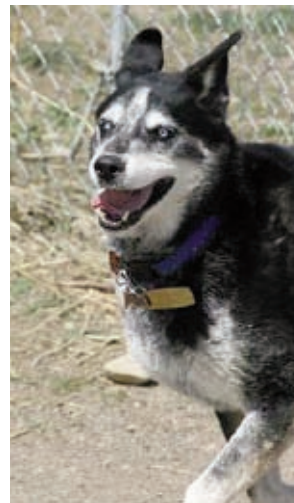
BLUE AROO UPDATE

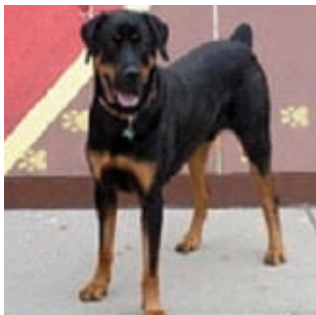

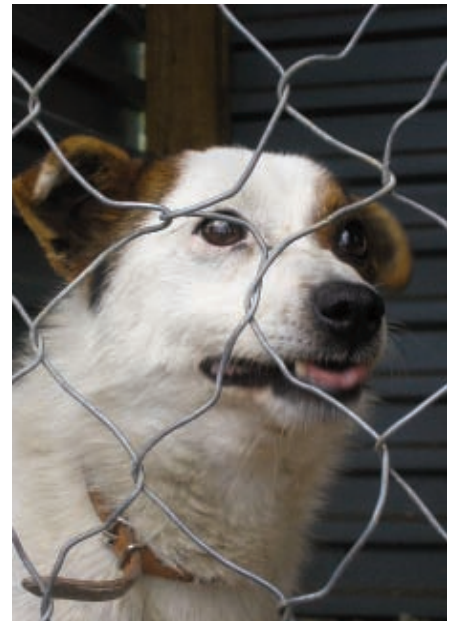
