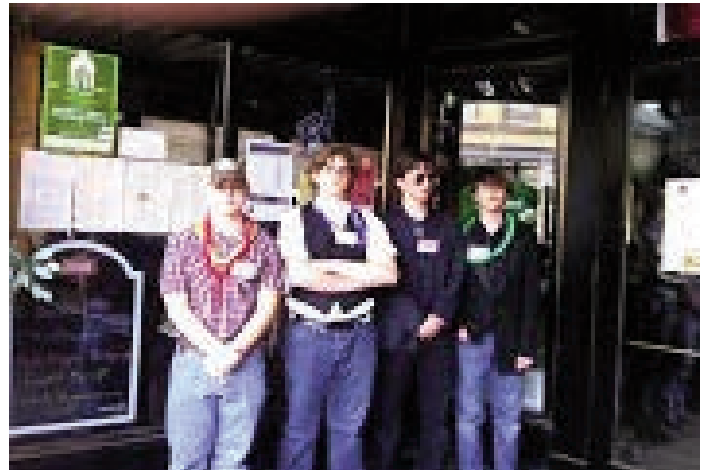
- Red Chili:** Pam Shanahan with "Cincinnati Red"

She helps the cats feel loved and gets them out of their cages until they find a home.

Like many staff and volunteers, Liz realized MaxFund has a lot of black cats. Like most shelters, MaxFund has a harder time adopting the black cats despite the fact that the black cats have awesome personalities. Rather than noticing this and doing nothing, Liz decided to take action. She realized that we need to focus on the black cats more and bring attention to them. So she created the "Black Kitty" party, which was held in January. Liz and other volunteers dressed as black kitties and handed out flyers with all of the black cats at MaxFund (at the time there were 43 adult black cats and a room full of black teenage kittens). Liz also decorated the shelter and put fun collars on the black cats, so they would stand out more. On the day of the party, MaxFund received three applications for black cats! The party also included a bake sale, which raised \$150! Liz plans on helping to make this an annual event.

FOSTER OF THE MONTH

EDUARDS RITMUS

Eduards is a fantastic volunteer at MaxFund who became a foster parent in October 2011. Shortly before that, MaxFund received an older, incredibly sweet cat named Baby. Baby loved people but didn't really like other cats. Unfortunately, at the shelter, she got stressed and stopped eating. To keep her alive, MaxFund had VCA give baby a feeding tube. Although it would seem like a feeding tube would guarantee the cat's life, a cat with a feeding tube is still in a very fragile position. They tend to survive better in a home than at the shelter.

When Eduards heard about Baby being on a feeding tube and needing a foster home, he stepped right up to take her. For over two months, he kept her alive by feeding her through her tube four times per day. Each feeding was a slow process, so she could get all the food she needed but in a way her stomach could handle. With each feeding, she sat in Eduards lap, and they grew close. When asked about his favorite experiences with her, he says, "My best experience with her changes almost weekly as there are new behaviors all the time. However, one that stands out, because it happens regularly and frequently now, is the first time she climbed into my lap and brought her head close to mine and placed her forehead on my chin, a gesture I have often seen cats make with each other's foreheads." According to Eduards, "it seems to be a friendly greeting by which both animals say, 'We're here together, and I'm here for you.'"

Why Does He Foster?

First he fostered because someone needed to do it or the animal would die. Although Baby now eats on her own, Eduards has remained her foster parent. She is an old cat so likely would never be adopted. But he has remained committed to her, because the relationship between Eduards and Baby grows closer every week.

He lives alone, so he feels Baby's presence almost all the time. When she's hiding, sometimes he asks aloud—not too loud because she doesn't like loud, sudden noises—where she is and what she's doing or thinking. They often eat at the same time, sleep at the same time and "watch" movies together. They are good company for each other despite the obvious differences. With each week, and in light of constantly growing information about DNA, he realizes more and more that animals on this planet are more similar to each other than different.

They all deserve to be in a loving home despite their age or medical condition.

Thank you, Eduards, for saving Baby's life and for staying committed to her.

You, too, can experience the joys of fostering. MaxFund is always in desperate need of foster homes, especially cat foster homes. Please contact the shelter today to find out how you can foster.

Yoda: An Understanding Foster Home, I Need

Megan King, a MaxFund staff member, recently wrote about Yoda, one of our special needs dogs, for Mile High Dog Magazine. Here's what she wrote. If Yoda can find a person or family willing to take him in as a foster dog, MaxFund will be happy to provide continuing consultation on his needs. Medical care will also be provided through the MaxFund Clinic at no charge.

Yoda is an adorable 11 year old Jack Russell Terrier in dire need of a foster or forever home with a patient and caring human. He suffers from various health problems which have led him to become easily agitated and therefore require special care.

He is a special needs dog who is fully deaf and partially blind. He has an eye issue which requires a strict daily regimen of eye drops in order to prevent associated discomfort. His hind legs are arthritic and pain is regulated with medication. He also has sensitive skin as is common with this breed and has developed grass and food related allergies requiring an allergen-free diet in addition to Benadryl when needed.

In February 2012, Yoda was returned to the MaxFund No-kill Animal Shelter where he had been adopted in 2006. A number of incidents involving defensive behavior, initiated by his physical handling resulted in his ultimate relinquishment. Shortly after his arrival at MaxFund, several issues became apparent. These ranged from physical concerns such as sensitivity around the eyes, stiffness in his hind legs, red and itchy skin to what initially appeared to be a mental shortcoming resulting in unpredictable irritability triggered by touch.

After months of observing Yoda, I have learned that he enjoys playing with his toys, going for walks and in general prefers to have company while eating and sleeping. He also takes delight in being scratched on the lower back in short increments and loves being rubbed on the face with soft toys. Although his eyesight is poor, he can follow simple basic commands. In terms of his dislikes, he is very uncertain of being touched by unfamiliar hands and is especially annoyed when petted. Touching his legs and ears should particularly be avoided upon initial interaction with Yoda, at least initially. Very few people have contact with Yoda

due to fear but all he needs is time and his true character will begin to shine.

Yoda has been living in tremendous pain which is the probable cause of his aggressive behavior. We have been able to give him the health care that he needs however, this little guy deserves to be in a loving home. There is no hope lost for Yoda as we have formed a strong bond. I continue to learn more about him and we gain each other's trust every day. Yoda is waiting for that special person who is willing to be very patient and commit to learning his unique ways.

An ideal home for Yoda would be one where he is the only pet and can be cared for by a single adult with no children. Apartment living would be suitable as he does not require much activity and should not have contact with grass due to his allergies. Yoda's separation anxiety causes anxious urination and therefore it would also be preferred for his caregiver to be at home on a regular basis unless this is not an issue.

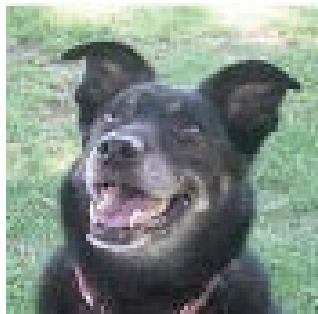

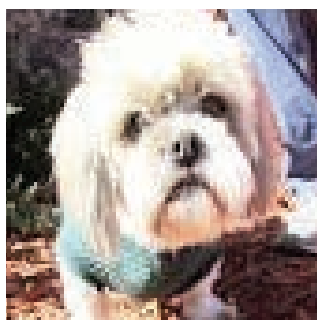

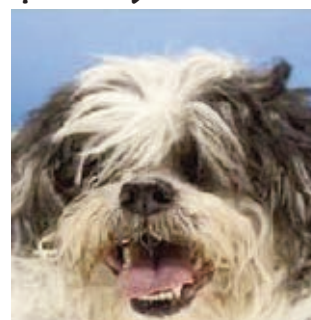
