

## Jack and Chico's Seeing Eye Fund

The story of blind dog Chico and his seeing-eye dog Jack went viral, and they have found their new and forever home! We tell the story of how they came to MaxFund elsewhere in this issue.

Jack and Chico still have a passion to help other blind dogs. Chico's eyes had to be removed because of an untreated eye infection, and he needed Jack to act as his eyes. But some of the blind dogs who come to MaxFund can have their vision restored! You may remember Squirt, for example. He came to MaxFund as an emaciated and blind stray. Out-of-control diabetes had made him blind. But cataract surgery restored his eyesight, and he has since found his happy forever home!

As you can imagine, though, cataract surgery costs thousands of dollars. MaxFund's mission is to take in injured and sick strays, rehabilitate them, and find them forever homes. But MaxFund's medical budget is not unlimited, and urgent and emergency care is a priority. So the funding of cataract surgery or other eye-related surgery sometimes has to wait until MaxFund's medical budget can accommodate it.

***That's why Jack and Chico are asking for your help! They are hoping to raise at least \$10,000 for the Seeing Eye Fund. \$10,000 would pay for about three cataract surgeries (with a generous discount from wonderful eye surgeons at the Veterinary Referral Center of Colorado). It could also pay for other eye-related surgeries, such as cherry eye and entropion.***

Not every blind dog who comes into MaxFund is lucky enough to have his own seeing eye dog! But Jack and Chico hope that, with your generous donations, the next several animals who come to MaxFund with a treatable eye condition will quickly get the surgery or other treatment they need so that they can see a path to a happy future!

## Jack and Chico: The Rest of Their Story

You'll remember the story of Jack and Chico, the middle-aged cattle dogs who came to MaxFund in search of a new and forever home. They spent several months at MaxFund because they needed to be adopted together. Chico has no eyes, and he relies on Jack, his best buddy, to serve as his seeing eye dog. After some wonderful publicity, a lovely family adopted them, and they are living a great life together in their new home!

Because of the circumstances of their arrival at MaxFund, very little was known about Jack and Chico's previous life together. Now, a close friend of Jack and Chico's former guardian has come forward to fill in some of the blanks. We are so grateful to her for telling us the story of Jack and Chico. We're holding aside some of the details to maintain privacy.

Jack and Chico's previous guardian went to the doctor one day for a sore hip. Shockingly, the diagnosis was advanced cancer, and passed away in hospice a month later, never seeing her beloved Jack and Chico again. Her primary

Mom and Dad are worried. By the time my little article is being read by you, we (the whole family, which consists of 3 dogs and 2 cats, and Mom and Dad) will be moving to the Denver area from South Carolina. Maybe if I were a two-legger, I would be worried too, but for me the future is whenever I finish this milk bone or whatever I'm doing at the moment.

They are worrying about me because I am a silly three year old puppy...because I have always lived on a farm and don't know what a city (*or a suburb*) is. The nearest town is three miles away from Gray Court, South Carolina. It claims to have more than two thousand residents, but I think they did their counting when everyone in town had invited all their relatives to a family reunion. We do have a stoplight. If we didn't the people on the two-lane wouldn't have noticed that they had just passed through beautiful downtown Gray Court.

What will the move mean to my daily life? Dad laughs at Gypsy and me; neither of us has ever been out of Laurens County. "Can you guys learn to be civilized?" Mom and Dad say that they are buying a house in a south Denver suburb that is on a kind of stream they call a "canal"; it has a walking path where Gypsy and I can still go on our daily walks and be more or less in the country. BUT...he says we have to stay on the path AND there will be other people with their dogs AND we are not allowed to jump on either of them. Don't they know friendly dogs when they see them? Is everyone that snooty?

When we walk down here, Gypsy is attached to Dad with a sixteen foot belly leash so Dad can have his hands free, and so that Gypsy won't take off and traverse the county. I have never walked on a leash except that once when I was dragged to the vet's office. That was the only time when I can remember being in a car; I'm afraid of them, maybe because of my being hit by one as a puppy before I was adopted. When we go for our walks, I just run free. The path serves as a general location that I can find Gypsy leading Dad when I come back to them after my latest crash through the woods.

Today Dad started our "civilizing". It took Gypsy a while to realize that Dad was serious about not getting ahead and pulling, but she had basically learned her lesson by the time they were heading back. Sometimes she is so sweet she makes me sick.

Everyone was holding their breath when it was my turn but I surprised myself. There were three first-time events happening at once: the first time taking a walk on a leash, first time walking with just Dad and no Gypsy, and first time on that unfamiliar trail. It must have just been so strange that I didn't even think to act in my usual wild and crazy manner. Once I tried to swerve behind Dad and tied his legs in the leash, but that old man was too fast for me.

Then Dad took us for a ride in the small SUV that will be our home for two or three days on the way to Denver. I had to be "helped" in. Gypsy loves riding in cars and would go from front seat to back and stick her head out of the cracked windows. I just sat there and lay down after a while.

We went to the dump at one end of town and then to the gas station at the other. By the end I was relaxed enough to even enjoy it a little, I think. Dad must have been joking when after telling us that we had been such good dogs he said, "I guess we won't have to leave you behind after all!"

Angel Marie is a 7 year old Bulldog. She loves walks and running in the yard. Playful.



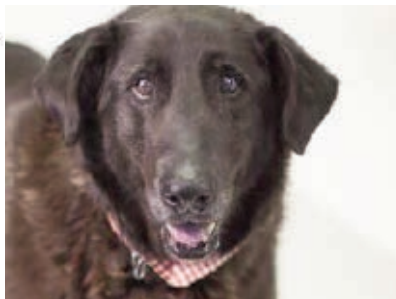

Bamboo is a 3 year old Border Collie mix. He is intelligent and loving. Playful and friendly.



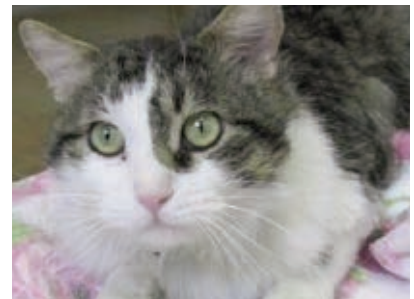

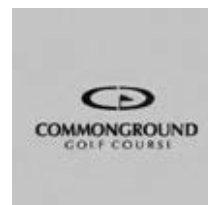

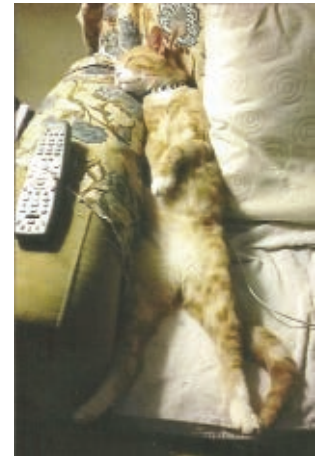
We wanted to let you know that Stewart who we adopted in February is doing very well. We love him very much and he adjusted to our house right away.

## Dog Definitions

**LEASH:** A strap which attaches to your collar, enabling you to lead your person where you want him/her to go.

**DOG BED:** Any soft, clean surface, such as the white bedspread in the guest room or the newly upholstered couch in the living room.

**DROOL:** is what you do when your persons have food and you don't. To do this properly you must sit as close as you can and look sad and let the drool fall to the floor, or better yet, on their laps.

**SMELL:** A social custom to use when you greet other dogs. Place your nose as close as you can to the other dog's rear end and inhale deeply, repeat several times, or until your person makes you stop. This can also be done to human's crotches.

concern throughout her ordeal was Jack and Chico's welfare, as she had been devoted to them. Her friend cared for Jack and Chico until she passed away.

Jack had been with their owner since puppyhood. Some years ago, after Jack's other good buddy passed away, The owner found Chico's photos on the website of another animal shelter. She thought it was cute that both of his eyes seemed to be closed in all of the photos! But when she visited Chico, she discovered he actually had no eyes.

Chico had ended up at the shelter because he'd had a serious eye infection that his previous owners left untreated. The shelter refused the owners' request to euthanize him. Chico received treatment at the shelter, but the infection had progressed too far to save his eyes. The owner, though, saw past his disability and looked straight into the heart of this sweet, smart, brave, cuddly boy. She fell in love with him instantly and adopted him.

Jack and Chico were inseparable. Whenever Jack would hear something outside, he would tear through the house and go barreling out the doggie door. Chico was a smart boy who'd quickly learned to use the doggie door with the help of a few hot dog treats! So he would always be hot on the heels of his buddy Jack. Once outside, they would explore the yard together, Jack in the lead and Chico right behind them. Jack and Chico also loved to take walks with her. She would wear a bell on her belt to help Chico maintain his bearings.

So the story of Jack and Chico is a sad and happy one. It's sad that Chico had such a terrible start, and lost his eyes. But how wonderful that he and Jack and his owner found each other and had a great life together. And it's tragic that Jack and Chico lost their beloved friend so suddenly. But thank goodness they ended up in the care of MaxFund, who promised to find them a new and forever home together! And, with the support of the media and all of the kind people around the country who sent their prayers and good wishes, that's exactly what happened.

As her friend told us, "She would be blown away by all this!"

Huge thanks to her friend for coming forward and filling in the blanks on Jack and Chico's story, and for loving and caring for them during the owner's ordeal. We would like to think that she is looking down on Jack and Chico with a big smile on her face, and the peace of knowing that they are still living a happy life together.
